








## Interpreting trends with 2021 data

## **About the Survey**

- Administered in the Fall statewide since 2000
- Administered every two years to youth in grades 6, 8, 10 &12
- Measures a variety of teen health attitudes and behaviors (substance abuse, depression, physical activity, presence of weapons in schools, etc.)
- Students across Washington participated in the survey
- 5,581 youth participated in Whatcom County, representing seven school districts.

## Uses of the data...

- Identifying community needs
- Guiding programs, policies, and services
- Tracking the impact of programs, policies, and services
- Compared with other data to form larger community profile


# Student Participation Whatcom County

- 1,509 (79%) of Grade 6 students
- 1,606 (83%) of Grade 8 students
- 1,472 (72%) of Grade 10 students
  - 994 (49%) of Grade 12 students


#### Gender Identity






#### Sexual Orientation






## **30-Day Use of Smoking Tobacco**Whatcom County (2000-2021)




## Current E-Cigarette Smoking or Vaping

Percent of students who report using an electronic cigarette, e-cig or vape pen in the past 30 days




## **30-Day Use of Alcohol** Whatcom County (2000-2021)



#### **Levels of Alcohol Use – Grades 10 and 12**





Percent of students who report having ridden in the past 30 days with a driver who had been drinking alcohol





#### Current Illegal Drug Use


Percent of students who report using illegal drugs in the past 30 days (not including alcohol, tobacco or marijuana)

#### Impact on a classroom




In a class of 30 students in grade 10 in Whatcom County:


- 21 are dealing with anxiety\*
- 12 are dealing with depression
  - 6 have contemplated suicide

  - 2 have attempted suicide




#### Contemplation of Suicide & Sexual Orientation

Percent of <u>Whatcom County 8<sup>th</sup> grade students</u> who report having seriously considered suicide in the past year & sexual orientation




## Bullying

Percent of <u>Whatcom County 8<sup>th</sup> grade students</u> who report being bullied in the past 30 days & sexual orientation




Feeling Safe During School

Percent of students who report that they feel safe during school




## Perceived Risk of Regular Alcohol Use

Percent of students who report "great risk" of harm from drinking alcohol daily




## Perceived Risk of Regular Marijuana Use

Percent of students who report "great risk" of harm from smoking marijuana at least once or twice a week




## Perceived <u>Availability</u> of Alcohol

Percent of students who report alcohol would be "very hard" to get




## Perceived **Availability** of Cigarettes

Percent of students who report cigarettes would be "very hard" to get





#### Statewide Relationship between WAH-ACEs score and mental health indicators, Grade 10




Statewide, more 10th grade students who felt sad or hopeless for at least two weeks in the past year reported higher WAH-ACEs scores.

Similarly, more 10th grade students who reported contemplating suicide reported higher WAH-ACEs scores than those who did not consider suicide.


#### Lifetime Sexual Abuse

Percent of students who report having ever been in a in a situation where someone made them engage in kissing, sexual touch or sexual intercourse when they did not want to




### **Impacts of Lifetime Sexual Abuse**


## Physical Abuse

130. Has an adult ever physically hurt you on purpose (like pushed, slapped, hit, kicked or punched you), leaving a mark, bruise or injury?




### **Depressive Feelings and School**

Percent of students in 10<sup>th</sup> grade that reported **depressive feelings** in the past year experienced **lower grades** and **missing school**.




### **Impact of Substance Use**

#### **Physical Abuse & Current Drinking**




If you feel sad or hopeless almost every day for two weeks or more in a row, to whom would you most likely turn to for help?

### Opportunities for School Involvement


Percent of students who report that they have lots of chances for involvement in school activities



### Children's Hope Scale

Hope reflects a future orientated mindset and motivational process toward attaining a desirable goal. Research has linked hope with overall physical, psychological, and social well-being.



## Children's Hope


Percent of students reporting "Moderately" or "Highly" hopeful in grades 6, 8, 10, 12 in 2018 and 2021.



# Hope Scale Components (Whatcom)

Research has shown that hope can be taught and is connected to academic achievements, well-being and positive life outcomes.

#### Hope Scale Component Questions Grade 10, 2021



#### **Pathway Questions:**

- I can think of many ways to get the things in life that are most important to me.
- When I have a problem, I can come up with lots of ways to solve it.


Pathways thinking is a child's belief in their capacity to find multiple ways to reach their goals.

#### **Agency Questions:**

- I am doing just as well as other kids my age.
- I think the things I have done in the past will help me in the future.

Agency thinking is a child's self-efficacy and motivation to use multiple ways to reach their goal.

# Statewide Relationship between WAH-ACEs score and Hope Scale, Grade 10




Statewide, 10th grade students who reported more hope tended to also have a lower WAH-ACEs scores.

NOTE: Hope is the belief that the future can be better than the past and you play a role in making it so. Hope can also be taught.

# Benefits of Hope

#### Statewide Relationships between High Hope, Grade 10



## For 10<sup>th</sup> graders statewide, those with **high levels of hope** are:

- More likely to find courses more interesting and helpful for their future
- More likely to think the things they are learning in school will be important later in life
- More likely to report having a person at schools that could help them if needed
- More likely to report getting high grades (A's or B's)

Compared to those with **lower levels of hope**.


# Benefits of Hope

## For 10<sup>th</sup> graders statewide, those with high levels of hope are:

- Less likely to be absent from school in the past month
- Less likely to not have eaten breakfast
- Less likely to not feel safe during school
- Less likely to use marijuana in the past 30 days
- Less likely to feel sad or hopeless
- Less likely to have seriously considered suicide in the past year


Compared to those with **lower** levels of hope.


## Impact of HOPE on Depression

Percent of **depression** among 8<sup>th</sup> grade students by Hope Scale.




## Impact of HOPE on & Marijuana Use

Percent of marijuana use among 10<sup>th</sup> grade students by Hope Scale.




### Impact of HOPE on & Attendance

## **Impact of HOPE on & Grades**


Percent of 10<sup>th</sup> grade students getting 'mostly A's & B's last year' by Hope Scale.



#### Excessive Television/Video Game Use


Percent of students who report 3 or more hours watching television, playing video games or using the computer for fun on an average school day
