**This year the Youth Philanthropy Project** funding will focus on building environments where youth can thrive using the proven **Icelandic Prevention Model** (IPM) as a guide.

This model empowers communities to come together, center voice and the needs of young people, and implement strategies increasing protective factors (like strong family bonds, participation in out of school activities, positive peer networks, and supportive school environments) and reduce risk factors (lack of meaningful activities, low parental engagement, easy access to drugs/alcohol, family conflict or high stress at home, bullying, etc.). The goal is to strengthen supports and conditions that help promote healthy youth development. Rather than focusing solely on individual behavior, the model promotes upstream, community-wide solutions.

#### **Grant Requirements**

- Youth input in design, planning, and/or implementation (even if adult-led in implementation)
- Should demonstrate potential to increase protective factors or reduce risk factors
- Must include an adult advisor or mentor
- Projects to focus on at least one of these areas:
  - 1. Organized out of school leisure time activity with structured, supported/supervised, meaningful engagement opportunities
  - Youth empowerment and leadership projects that build youth voice, civic engagement, or peer mentorship
  - Family and Community engagement that strengthen family bonds and community connections
  - 4. Peer Connection and Social Belonging reducing isolation and promoting inclusivity

2026 Youth Philanthropy Project Grant Round 5. Healthy Habits & Lifestyle Education: activities that promote wellness, nutrition, and substance use prevention (school or community based)

Note: While not all activities must be implemented or led entirely by youth, all project ideas must come from youth themselves and reflect their voices, priorities, and creativity. Adult advisors or partners may help with planning and execution.

The **Youth Philanthropy Committee** will review grants and make awards up to \$5,000 to nonprofits, schools, Native American Tribes and government agencies that directly support prevention goals and positive youth development.
